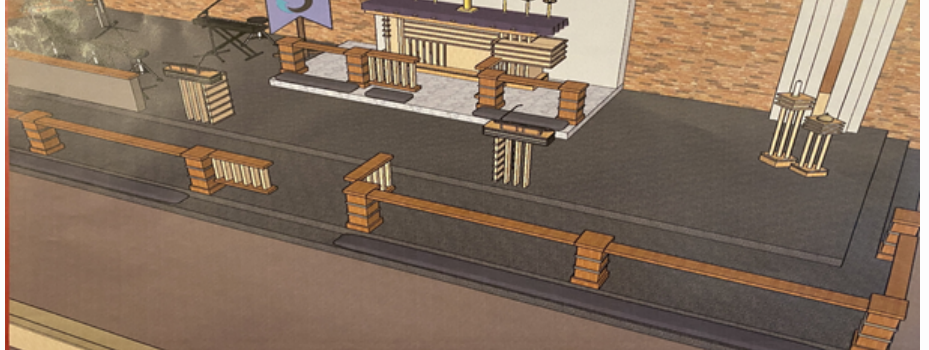

Board of Evangelism Update

During the pandemic the Board of Evangelism took a little different approach to our work and moved to some internal evangelism opposed to outreach.

We knew there was a group of people who were more isolated than ever by the need to “stay home” and we wanted to maintain some connection with them. We divided this list of people, got some help from several other members, and began making weekly phone calls to them and sending cards of encouragement to them. We also sent Christmas cards, Valentine’s Day cards, Easter cards, and many birthday cards. This has tapered off as extended care facilities have been able to safely open to visitors, a return to church has become available, and families have been able to safely gather.

During the early time of the pandemic, with the help of our Sunday School leaders, we were able to link students with individuals on our list and we were able to do that again at Christmas time. Several people I have spoken to were very happy to receive pictures or handmade cards from the children.

I thank each member of the Board of Evangelism and the extra people who helped us to accomplish a connection for members in extended care facilities and those more isolated at home during this time. I also want to thank each Sunday School family who participated and helped those individuals to feel God’s love and the love of their church family.

Lambeau Field – A New Year!

Green Bay has a great venue for watching football – Lambeau Field! More than 70,000 people visit at least 10 times per year to watch the Packers take on their NFL opponents. Not always at Lambeau Field, but the Packers have brought in visitors from around the world for 100 years!

Our Saviour has contracted with the concessions company, Green Bay SportService, to run a concession stand for all home events at Lambeau Field beginning with Family Night (date to be determined). We plan to serve in the 4th Floor Club Seat area (temperature-controlled) as we have in the past.

We need to provide 20-25 workers per event to serve hungry and thirsty Club Seat ticket holders. No experience is necessary; on-the-job training provided. Anyone age 14 and older can work; minors must have a picture drivers' license or student picture ID and birth certificate for proof of age.

The uniform is your own black or khaki pants and comfortable (closed toe/closed heel/rubber soled) shoes; a polo shirt and hat are provided. Currently face masks are required but that may change in the future.

Jobs include cooking, wrapping, cashier assistant, etc. Minors will not handle alcohol or work registers. Work one or all events; your help for any event would be greatly appreciated. Meet at OSLC to arrive by carpool or drive yourself and meet in the stand (you are responsible for finding your own parking).

Paperwork, training and more are pending. More information will be provided as it becomes available.

Working at Lambeau Field is an amazing fundraiser for Our Saviour Lutheran Church. Please consider working one or more games and being part of the efforts that can raise more than \$30,000 per season for Our Saviour!

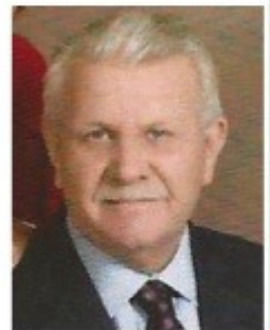
