"Life is a storm, my young friend. You will bask in the sunlight one moment, be shattered on the rocks the next. What makes you a man is what you do when that storm comes."

Alexandre Dumas From The Count of Monte Cristo

Recall the Gospel reading of the disciples on a boat in a storm. They thought they were going to die. Jesus was asleep on a cushion in the back of the boat. Out of fear for their lives, the disciples woke Jesus up to save them. He calmed the storm.


Some of the old timer (ancient) Christian thinkers saw that event and reversed it as follows:

That Gospel account means that the disciples in the storm were the ones asleep, asleep in their faith. The storm (suffering) woke them up to call on Christ who was fully aware of their trouble, even when He appeared to be at rest. Christ was waiting to hear from them. Then He answered their request.

In our storm, are we the ones who are asleep and Christ waiting to hear from us? Allow your suffering to be your teacher, to wake you up in faith, to call on Christ, to yield to His will, to share in His suffering. Even when we are fully awake in our faith, that does not mean our suffering will go away when we seek Christ in prayer.

God may allow that suffering to remain but use it as a tool to teach us. Our suffering may have meaning, and we need to detect what that meaning is. Viktor Frankl in his book, Man's Search for Meaning is an excellent help with this. Baruch Spinoza (1632–77), in his book, Ethics, said this about seeing (visualizing) our suffering: "Emotion, which is suffering, ceases to be suffering as soon as we form a clear and precise picture of it."

Consider taking out a scratchpad and using it to see your unseen suffering. Write down what your suffering is:



- B. Is it emotional suffering? Now describe it.
- C. Spiritual suffering? Now describe it.
- D. Mental suffering? Now describe it.

Now you have contained it, you have netted it, boxed it in. There it is, in black and white in front of your eyes.

Now you can begin to manage it. It is not overtaking you, you are overtaking it, with Christ's help.

Is it more than one or all of them at the same time? For myself, I see them all connected, intertwined and one or more triggering the other.



Suffering teaches. It carves and crafts, whittles, and shapes us. God uses it to create a deep spiritual humility in our hearts. And suffering improves us if we let it. A knife does not want to meet up with a sharpening stone, but it is improved after that encounter.

How can our suffering be a spiritual teacher? What do we learn about ourselves?

In the Bible book, Job, there is a spot where Job and his mis-guided friends are talking. All of a sudden, God speaks to them. To paraphrase, God stooped down with a strong voice and said, "I am God and you are not." And is not that the first lesson that suffering teaches?

Does this topic intrigue you? We are offering a fall course that will include this topic: "7 Habits of Highly Effective Christians." It starts October 6 and meets for six Wednesday evenings from 6–7:30pm. No cost, only your time. Call or email the church office today to sign up!

"Don't Write a Check" Giving Options

Our Saviour Lutheran Church and our mission schools (Green Bay Trinity Lutheran School and N.E.W. Lutheran High School) receive cash donations from your time. How can you use your time to give in 2021? Just a few of the options are shown below:

Purchase SCRIP – You buy groceries, gas, or maybe even eat at a restaurant, right? Walmart, Target, Festival Foods, Pick n' Save, Kwik Trip, Shell gas stations, McDonald's, Red Lobster, Culver's, Starbucks...these are daily or weekly stops, aren't they? Gift cards purchased from Our Saviour, for these and many other businesses, provide cash to Our Saviour. Call the church office to order and schedule a pickup time. Even with our COVID protocols in place for most of 2020, we still realized a sales profit of \$4,620.17. YES, your small order IS worth it.

Amazon – When you start at smile.amazon.com and select Our Saviour Lutheran Church, .5% of your eligible purchases will be added to a check that is sent each quarter to OSLC. In 2020, your purchases using smile.amazon.com provided a donation of \$100.53 to OSLC.

Save your empty ink and toner cartridges and bring them to church. These are recycled for a credit of \$2 each which is then used to purchase supplies at OfficeDepot/OfficeMax...this win/win opportunity helps Our Saviour AND keeps recyclables out of the landfill!

Thrivent Financial members can log into their account and assign any amount of available ThriventChoice dollars to one or more designated charities, including Our Saviour. The opportunity to direct money to a specific charity is provided to you as a benefit of being a member of Thrivent Financial (not all product owners qualify; contact Thrivent with questions). ThriventChoice dollars (total: \$8,720.00) were received as donations to the church and preschool in 2020.

Box Tops for Education can benefit Green Bay Trinity Lutheran School. Download the **BTFE** app and **scan your receipts** when you purchase BTFE branded products. BTFE products containing an actual box top coupon (must include an expiration date and not be expired) can be placed in the collection bin by the 2nd floor elevator at any time. Using the app will provide information on how to earn bonus Box Tops, too.

Coca-Cola products have numbered codes on plastic bottle caps, cartons and overwraps. Each is worth \$0.05 or more each and that adds up quickly. Bring the caps or code number from the carton or overwrap to the collection bin by the 2nd floor elevator any time. Codes are entered online to benefit Green Bay Trinity.

OfficeDepot receipts can be used in many ways...

When you make a purchase online, take one more step to give. Click 'Designate a school' and enter the number (Green Bay Trinity: 70211025 or NEW Lutheran High: 70108935) or search for the school of your choice. You will need the order number from your email confirmation.

When you purchase at the store, tell them you want to donate to a school and give them one of the numbers above (or they can look it up by name).

If you do not have an OfficeDepot rewards membership, bring the receipt or online order number to Our Saviour. We can enter it online as a purchase to receive rewards and purchase credit to reach VIP status.

Board of Evangelism Activities

One of the projects the Board of Evangelism has worked on over the past few years is maintaining a connection with the Active Military Members of our church as well as family of our members. Of course, we are dependent upon the congregation to submit those names to us and to keep their contact information current. We have requested that information several times a year through the Voice and the Announcements.

At Christmas time, we sent cards on behalf of the Board of Evangelism and OSLC. In March and April we worked to update our lists through requests in the Voice, the Announcements, and telephone calls.

May was National Recognition of Active Military Month. In May we published the list of names, their rank, the branch of service they are in, and their connection with Our Saviour. We also sent a card thanking them for their service and either an Uncle Mike's kringle/gift certificate or a box of Seroogy's candy, depending upon their location in the world. Board of Fellowship News

Super Sale dates are set for August 13, 14 and 15th. Please mark your calendars and save those dates for shopping and also helping at the sale. As in the past, Friday will be reserved for OSLC members, staff and Trinity teachers. We will be open from 4–6:30 that evening and will need servants to help run the sale. Saturday hours will begin at 8am and close at 3pm. We will be serving cinnamon rolls when we open and booyah as soon as it is ready. We will also be selling sloppy joes and beverages so come early to eat, shop and take a turn at helping with the sale. Sunday will be $\frac{1}{2}$ price beginning at 9–11:30am.

Donations can be brought to the church and stored in covered boxes that are stackable. Please check with the church office for the placement of your donations in the hallway near the office. However, we can't take any furniture until it can be put in the gym. Please don't take any more to the basement. If it is possible for you to hold your donations until we start setting up in the gym on July 26, it would be greatly appreciated. Storage space is at a minimum this year. Please remember we do not take clothes, shoes, stained or broken merchandise. No exercise equipment, entertainment cabinets, expired car seats, cribs, mattresses or box springs, furniture made of particle board, only flat panel TVs, no computer equipment, phones or other electronics as these things do not normally sell and then must be recycled or we have to pay to dispose of them properly. We want fiction and cookbooks only; please no non-fiction or magazines. Everything must be clean, in good working order and something you would buy. Please ask if you are not sure before you donate it.

We will begin set-up for the sale on Monday, July 26 at 9am. We will especially need people capable of lifting boxes and furniture from the basement to the gym. A special plea to the youth of our congregation to please consider coming in that morning to help. If you need a ride, please call the office to let us know several days in advance and if possible, we will find someone to pick you up and take you home. The day after the sale, on Monday, August 16 we will also need people to help load the truck that will take what is left. Any questions about bringing donations up from the basement, loading the truck or to volunteer, please direct to Mike Baneck at 920-660-1250. Every day after that, we will work from 9am-3pm to get ready for the sale. Come and go as you have the time. If you would like to stay and have lunch, we welcome and encourage you to bring your lunch and spend time getting to know the others that are also donating their time and talent for this sale.

Watch for sign-up sheets for the sale days and announcements as to where you will find the sign up sheets. We also ask you to begin saving plastic containers for booyah sales. We need the large ice cream pails, as well as 64 oz., 48 oz. and 32 oz. heavy plastic containers with lids and empty shoe boxes. Donations of zip lock bags of all sizes and donations of cans of soda and bottled water are also welcomed. These donations can be left with the other donations in the office hallway. If you have any boxes with either covers or flaps that can be folded, please bring those as well. As the sale dates get closer, we will have fliers you can take to post at places that allow you to hang signs. There will also be smaller handouts for you to give to family, friends and neighbors. We will have yard signs to display in your yards the week before the sale. We ask you to take one or as many as you can place around the area and then remove them and bring them back to church on August 15th or as soon as possible after the sale. The yard signs can be used year after year so we appreciate having them returned. Please watch for more announcements as they become available in the coming weeks. If you can help in any way with making sure this sale is a great success, please sign up to help on the sale days. For preparing the gym for the sale, just come and spend as much time as you are able. We need many hands to make this sale a success, so please plan to help. We are also seeking a new chairperson for next year. Now is the time to learn if this is something you would like to consider. We can't do this without lots of help, so please prayerfully consider helping with the Super Sale this year. If you have questions or comments, please call Jill Proulx at 920-265-1402 or the church office.

Fish Fries will begin again on Friday, September 10th. Serving times are 5pm-6:30pm or until we run out of food. We are still seeking one more person to complete the 4 person Fish Fry Management team. We begin with Thursday afternoon preparations. This is the time we fill condiment containers, prepare coleslaw, cut lemons, make lemonade, wash and wrap potatoes and various other duties to get ready for Friday. On Friday, we need people to prepare fish, fill coleslaw cups, make coffee, fill water pitchers, prepare busing carts, cut desserts, cook, prep food plates, waitress, serve food to guests, wash dishes, take down tables and chairs and clean the kitchen and gym after serving is complete and take laundry home and return to church. Servants do get a discounted price on their meal. Youth are needed to serve coffee, lemonade and sodas to our guests and also to bus tables. Any youth servants will split the tips which will go into your youth accounts at church. Youth receive a free meal of chicken strips and fries before the serving begins. If you need a ride in order to serve, please call the church office several days in advance and we will try to find someone to pick you up. Our Saviour Lutheran hats and aprons will be provided when you work the fish fries. If you have hats at home from before the pandemic, bring those with you when you come. If you have a Thrivent shirt from a previous event, please wear those as well. If you are willing to apply for Thrivent Action Team funds, please let the church office or Jill Proulx know.

Once again, in order to make this event successful, we need your help. If you have helped in the past, you are already on our email list and will be notified when we seek servants. If your information has changed, please call the office to notify us of any changes. If you have not yet helped, but would like to now, we also need you to contact the office so you can be added to the Fish Fry Servant email list. We can't do these events without your help. Please prayerfully consider giving a few hours of your time to make this event successful.

We also need you to spread the word to your family, friends and neighbors that our fish fries will begin again in September. These monthly fish fries are intended for the community so be sure to spread the message that they will begin again in September and continue on the second Friday of each month. Carry outs are also available by calling the church office by 4pm on Fridays.

We look forward to answering any questions or comments on the fish fries by calling Jill Proulx at 920–265–1402 or the church office. We hope to see you there to help and to enjoy the great food and fellowship these events provide.
