All Saints' Day is observed by Christians in many countries around the world. In countries such as Spain, Portugal and Mexico, offerings are made on this day. In countries such as Belgium, Hungary and Italy people bring flowers to the graves of dead relatives. In other parts of Europe, such as Austria, Croatia, Poland, and Romania, it is customary to light candles on top of the graves of deceased relatives. It is also observed in parts of Asia, such as the Philippines, where people visit graves of deceased relatives and clean or repair them. They also lay flowers on the graves and light candles.

In France church services in memory of all the saints are held on November 1 but by the evening the focus turns towards the dead. Cemeteries everywhere are crowded with people who come to clean and decorate family graves. All Saints' Day is closely tied with All Souls' Day, held on November 2, which is dedicated to prayers of the dead who are not yet glorified. According to some sources, the idea for All Saints' Day goes back to the fourth century when the Greek Christians kept a festival on the first Sunday after Pentecost (in late May or early June) in honor of all martyrs and saints. Other sources say that a commemoration of "All Martyrs" began to be celebrated as early as 270 CE but no specific month or date is recorded. Pope Gregory IV made All Saints' Day an authorized holiday in 835 CE. (1.)

As We Move Into a Pastoral Vacancy

While we grieve the loss of Pastor Ros and pray for His work in the Army to be a blessing, we now enter into a pastoral vacancy.

We have operated with one pastor before. When Pastor Art retired, we went 6 years in search of a second pastor. When Pastor Hovland took a Call, we were vacant for 2-3 years. This is not a crisis, but an opportunity to stretch ourselves and grow.

There is a fairly dramatic downward trend in available pastoral candidates right now, and worse, in the years to come. We need to be in prayer for our future leadership. Please see the statistics shared with us recently.

WHEREAS, Enrollment statistics from 2004 to 2018 demonstrate a decrease in students enrolled in our Concordia University church worker programs:

- Pre-seminary (-59%)
- Lutheran Teacher (-61%)
- Director of Christian Education (-56%)
- Director of Christian Outreach (-71%)
- Deaconess (-43%) (numbers do not include seminary deaconess program enrollment)
- Lay Ministry (-95%)
- Director of Parish Music (-47%)
- Director of Family Life (-65%) and

WHEREAS, Enrollment statistics from 2004 to 2018 demonstrate a decrease in men enrolled in our two seminaries:

- Master of Divinity (MDiv) Concordia Seminary (CSL) (-61%); Concordia Theological Seminary (CTSFW) (-44%)
- Combined MDiv loss (-55%)
- CSL total loss including Alternate Route (AR) and non-residential enrollments (-34%)
- CTSFW total loss including AR and non-residential enrollments (-44%)
- Combined total loss including AR and nonresidential enrollments (-38%) and

WHEREAS, Fifty percent of all active ordained pastors are over 55 years old; and with current enrollment trends into the seminary and active pastor retirement trends, the active pastor population in the LCMS could decrease from 6,000 to 3,000 active pastors in the next 15 years; and

WHEREAS, The current enrollments will not support graduating classes sufficient to meet the needs of the church in terms of filling upcoming vacancies for ordained and commissioned ministers of religion;

Current Synodical vacancy report:

- 364 congregations are calling a sole pastor
- 53 are calling a senior pastor
- 54 are calling an assoc. pastor
- Those vacant congregations that are not even calling at this time is 471
- These numbers could increase if we don't enroll more men in the seminary and if the baby-boomer pastors keep retiring out.

Do you know why this world's such a dangerous place? It's because of who lives here with us. "And there was war in heaven. Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon and his angels fought back." (Revelation 12:7) This is the archangel, Michael. The dragon (remember this is the figurative language part of Revelation) is a picture of the devil. When the devil and his evil angels rebelled against the Lord God, they fought against the archangel Michael and all the good angels with him. It was the battle above, the battle that took place in heaven.



The devil thought he could overtake the Lord and His holy angels "but he was not strong enough, and they lost their place in heaven." (Revelation 12:8) The devil was not strong enough to overcome the archangel Michael and the perfect angels with him who were truth and purity. So the devil and the other fallen angels were cast from heaven never to return again. But where did they go? Where did God send them?

"The great dragon was hurled down—that ancient serpent called the devil, or Satan, who leads the whole world astray. He was hurled to the earth, and his angels with him." (Revelation 12:9) Woah, wait? God sent them where? God sent them here? Here among us to rule and ruin this world, our world? This text reveals the world is the devil's playground and, in many ways, we end up being his play things, his toys to use and abuse and mistreat. At least that's how it feels sometimes to live in this broken world.

And it's not just the devil who's with us. "And his angels with him." How many angels is that? We don't know an exact number, but we have an idea of the percentage. In verse four of this same chapter, we hear that the devil, pictured here as a dragon, did this. "Its tail swept a third of the stars out of the sky and flung them to the earth." (Revelation 12:4) The only things swept out of heaven with the devil were the fallen angels who rebelled against God with him. So approximately one third of all the created angels are now exceedingly powerful evil angels. That's rather terrifying!

We see their handiwork of horror in this world as they, with the devil, lead people astray and away from the Lord into the darkness of evil. For many of us, there was a time when you were away from the Lord. You didn't prioritize Him in worship or prayer. You knew what the Bible said on how you were to live but you lived a different way, your way instead. The influence of the evil one, the devil, was upon you.

It still is. We all are tempted to be led away from the Lord's love and mercy. That's the devil's goal and plan upon this earth to gather as many souls with him in the misery of hell as he can. He swept his tail and a third of the angels fell with him. Every day he sweeps his tail to knock more people off the pathway of righteousness as he tempts us to sin.

Again and again and again temptation comes attacking you, enticing you to break God's heart by breaking His law. But you want to focus on God's Word and will for your life just like how I wanted to write a sermon! But when distractions and temptations are on you, it's so hard to focus. What temptation comes your way constantly dive-bombing your heart and pulling you astray? No matter what it is...pride, lust, greed, addiction or even the doubt that God's love could be merciful enough to save a sinner like you...no matter what the temptation is upon you, it's not going to stop. Ever. Never. It will not stop. Why? Because the devil lives among us because God cast him here. Why? Why would God do that to us? It seems unfair, as if He is setting us up to sin.

Just as we need to read the Book of Revelation remembering two truths, there are also two amazing truths to know and remember which reveal WHY God banished the devil from heaven down to earth. When you know these truths, you know Christ's powerful love and mercy for you!

1) Jesus won and BANISHED the devil from heaven's throne. First of all, Jesus won! Always remember, Jesus won! He always does. Even when you feel defeated, Jesus won! When temptation has overcome you and you feel weak and worn out, Jesus won! Jesus defeated the devil in heaven above and Jesus defeated the devil on the earth below. JESUS WON! And you are on Christ's winning team. Remember Jesus won and banished the devil from heaven's throne. Do you realize how significant this is to your soul especially as you sin? Because Jesus won, He can give the gift of forgiveness.

When the devil was cast from heaven, he no longer stood in God's throne room able to accuse you and lie about you. "The accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down." (Revelation 12:10) The devil never stops accusing you before God, day and night he cries out against you trying to get you banished to hell with him. But the devil's no longer in heaven! He's no longer in the courtroom! Whenever there is a controversial trial going on in the US, there are protestors outside the courtroom yelling and screaming for that person to be convicted and even killed. But they're outside the courtroom. They can yell and scream all they want but they have no say.

Because Jesus won and defeated the devil, because the devil was banished from heaven and from God's holy throne room, he can yell and scream and accuse you all he wants but he has no say in your trial. Jesus alone stands beside you to defend or banish. If you have faith in Him, which you do, and if you trust that His perfect death on the cross paid for every single one of your sins making you washed clean and holy before the Lord, which you do, then Jesus defends you and God declares you "Not guilty"! And the devil can do nothing about it because he was banished from heaven.

But for those who reject Jesus, which you don't, and those who live a life of sin without care of what God thinks, which you don't, those unbelieving people Jesus will not defend before the Father but He will banish like the devil was because they rejected Jesus' forgiveness and the gift of salvation. The devil has no say in the judgment; he was banished to earth.

Why to earth? Why would God do that? Isn't He setting us up for failure, sending the devil among us? Take comfort, find peace in this final truth.



2) Jesus won and BOUND the devil on earth. Jesus won! He always does! And because He won, He bound the devil. “He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him...” (Revelation 20:2). The book of Jude verse six tells us it wasn’t just the devil who was bound. “And the angels who did not keep their positions of authority but abandoned their proper dwelling—these He has kept in darkness, bound with everlasting chains...” Jesus won which means the devil is bound up! Yes, he is here among us but Jesus battle above and the battle below, the battle for your heart. Take heart, have joy... Jesus wins! He always does! Amen. (2.)

75 Years of Outdoor Ministry!

In the mid-2000s a committee of Camp Luther leaders and supporters were assembled to consider the mission of Camp Luther. A mission statement is an action-oriented statement declaring the purpose an organization serves.

The committee discussed summer camps, year-round retreats, family camp, volunteer opportunities, and every way in which Camp Luther ministers to people who visit the camp. They considered the transforming impact of the ministry on children, high

school youth, summer staff, families, and volunteers. And they wrestled with the question, "Why do we have a camp?"

Through several days of meetings that included prayer and study of God's Word, the committee came forward with the following mission statement "Building up the Body of Christ for service and witness to the world." That statement was later altered to the mission we know today "Building up all people in Christ for service and witness to the world."

That newly adopted mission statement echoed back to another time in the history of the camp. In 1968, 22 years after the founding of the camp, Mr. Walter Roehl, of Wausau, WI, a member of the original Camp Committee wrote an article for the North Wisconsin District Lutheran Witness to encourage involvement and remind everyone of the purpose of Camp. He wrote:

"Camp Luther provides a creative Christian educational experience in cooperative living in the outdoors. It uses the resources of the natural surroundings to contribute significantly to mental, physical, social, and spiritual growth. It provides opportunities for boys and girls to observe young adults - counselors, whom they learn to admire and imitate, speak and live as children of God. It provides opportunities for boys and girls to encourage one another and build up one another in the faith through words and actions."

Through God's faithfulness, the mission of Camp Luther has continued for 75 years! Thousands of children, summer staff, families, retreat participants, and volunteers have been encouraged and built up in their faith through their experiences at Camp Luther.

In February of this year, the North Wisconsin District Board of Directors passed a resolution in honor of Camp Luther's 75th year of outdoor ministry in which they asked congregations to:

- Offer prayers and thanksgiving to God for the ministry of Camp Luther.
- Encourage your church members to get involved at camp in different programs provided.
- Encourage your church family to support the ministry at Camp Luther through special thank offerings for Every Kid to Camp and the completion of the Community Center.

Thank you for celebrating 75 years of Camp Luther! Thank you for your prayers, your involvement, and your gifts in support of this ministry! This is your camp!

Greetings from Cameroon!

After the Bible translation and literacy teams were chosen in June we began training them on how to use computers. We had planned for three months of training, but with their hard work they were able to acquire the skills needed in just three weeks! We continually thank God for their engagement and excitement. Late July was another day we will remember as the translators tried their very first (very rough) translation of the first verses of Luke! The translators are beginning to understand just how great of a task, and responsibility, Bible translation is.

Recently, the translation team visited the elderly blind man who had helped start the literacy center in the Subula* area before our arrival. You may remember his story we've shared previously about giving up the best building in his compound to be dedicated as a temporary literacy center. The man had undergone surgery, so the team went to greet and pray with him. During our time together they were able to use the newly printed song-books to encourage him and they even read the first verses of Luke they had just translated the week prior! Tears welled up in the man's eyes as he heard, for the first time, the Holy Scriptures in his own dialect of Subula*.

The literacy team has been working as hard as the translators, creating materials for the secondary school class, completing and distributing the alphabet chart, and making a primer—the book that will be used to teach in the village literacy classes planned for January 2022. We would need a much longer letter to share all the stories and amazing progress we are seeing in this project right now. We've been asking God why He would choose this seemingly crucial time to ask us to take a furlough in the US. It seems like such poor timing from our human perspective. But He has been reminding us that literacy and Bible translation projects are meant to be driven and guided by the community, and that our absence at this important time will help them take more and more ownership of this work.

Operation Wisconsin Joy

Mike and Laura Baneck recently received a phone call from their daughter SFC Kristin Baneck, currently deployed by the Army National Guard to Baltimore, telling them OSLC “had to do something” to help the Afghan Refugees at Fort Mc Coy. Kristin, a lifetime member of OSLC completed a deployment to Afghan in 2011 and felt the need to help get things going for the Afghan refugees who she had worked with and who helped her keep her safe. A call was made to Pastor Ros, US Army Major Chaplain here at OSLC and he got the ball rolling!!

A zoom meeting was held with Kristin where thoughts and ideas were shared. Pastor Ros readily made a connection with Team Rubicon at Fort McCoy! Pastor Ros then pulled together a team of members of OSLC and work began to collect donations to fill a truck with needed supplies for the refugees and was able to secure a donated truck for transport to Fort McCoy.

A facebook posting was done, phone calls were placed to 47 area churches plus area LCMS churches were contacted by email, area businesses were called, local veteran’s groups were contacted, and the word was spread to family and friends. A schedule of volunteers was created to man the collection area, and the area was set up for the sorting of donations.

By noon on Wednesday the donations were coming in and sorting was in progress. Calls were received from several area churches for pick ups that were done by Mike Baneck, Harvey Boeder, and Jeff Luepke. Trips were made to pick up donated store gift cards and shopping was done with those gift cards. Amazon ordering and delivering was ongoing! Visits were made by Catholic Charities and the Mayor’s office.

As a box filled with a specific supply, it was taped shut and the items were identified to ease the work of those on the receiving end of the operation. Truckloads of donations were met with excitement and readily got sorted into the appropriate boxes.

Sunday was very busy from about 11:00 until 3:45!! Individual donations came in, drop offs were made by Prince of Peace in Sturgeon Bay, St. John’s in Rankin, Bethel Baptist, Faith Chapel, Hope Lutheran, First Presbyterian and Bay Evangelical Covenant. Pick ups were done at Redeemer, Pilgrim, Faith, and Chamber Hills Bar & Grill. Lots and lots of sorting was done, many boxes were filled, and MANY people helped!!

Shortly after 2:00 pm, the truck arrived and all who came to load that truck got to work and got it done in short order!! On Monday morning Pastor Ros and Mike Baneck took the truck to Fort Mc Coy for the delivery of many pounds of hygiene products, diapers, bottled water, clothing, and food for the Refugees living at Fort McCoy.

We would like to thank those that helped with the sorting and truck loading as well as everyone from Our Saviour and the community at large for providing the items we were able to collect and deliver in such a short time (we apologize if we missed you; it was a blessing to have so many people working together).
