What makes us uncomfortable?

People like to hang on to things.

When we were kids, it maybe was our teddy bear, or our blanket with a special shiny cloth border. We hang on to things because they bring us comfort.

What do we hang on to when we are uncomfortable?

There are physical things we hang on to. A cane. A walker. Handrails on a staircase.

When people stand around drinking coffee, I wonder if the cup is actually just something to hang on to that subconsciously makes them feel safe. It does me!

We accumulate and surround ourselves with things that make us feel comfortable. I wonder if a packrat has not developed an emotional attachment to absolutely everything that they have. They surround themselves with things that are emotionally comforting. Perhaps these things make them feel safe?

We are not robots. We are people with emotions.

And some of those emotions include being uncomfortable, afraid, concerned, or sensing that our life is in danger or at risk. So, we bring things toward us, or hang on to things that ease our discomfort and bring us comfort.



And the things we bring toward ourselves for comfort are blessings if we don't love them more than God or if our love for them doesn't overpower us. That might be an addiction.

But what if everything was taken from us?

Examples:

A man standing on the railing of the sinking titanic.

A person standing naked in the gas chamber in Nazi Germany, taking their last breath of fresh air.



But we return to the two questions. What makes us uncomfortable?

There's a super long list of what makes humans uncomfortable. Speaking in front of a large group of people. Heights. Closed places. Hunger. Thirst. Loneliness. Rejection. Lack of provisions. An uncertain future. And the list continues infinitely.

What do we turn to, to comfort ourselves?

Alcohol. A walk. Listening to music. Did someone say cookies? Hanging out with good friends. Watching a comedy. Silence. Turning off the news. Shutting off the computer. And this list also continues infinitely.

It is very dangerous and very tempting to cross lines when it comes to what we reach for here and how we comfort ourselves.

It is human to be uncomfortable.

God knows this.

After Adam and Eve's fall into sin, God found them in a very uncomfortable state hiding under the bushes. Shame.

He clothed them, in caring for them He gave them promises of restoration and His ongoing presence.

There isn't a single human who is not uncomfortable about something. If they don't show it, they're hiding it.

Why is it some days are easier than others? Did you ever study a river?

In the film, The African Queen, they encounter beautiful flat water, then rapids, some snags, a few rocks, horrible leeches, unexpected waterfalls, beautiful flat water again and even getting stuck in the weeds. This is a metaphor for exactly how life is.





We want to be comfortable all the time. But it doesn't happen. How we find comfort during uncomfortable times, during discouraging events, is the secret.

As you know, Saint Paul in the New Testament encountered very rough days and some smooth days. He probably had more rough than smooth. But he wished to teach his readers what Christ had taught him, that no matter what your situation, reach to Christ in your discomfort, and you shall be comforted.

"Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." - Philippians 4:11-13 NKJV

Are you uncomfortable? Is fear overtaking you? Are you retreating into a lonely place and it's only getting worse?

Here's some advice for us all:

- 1. Consider setting up a small location in the house for you to go and focus on your faith. Some call it a Prayer Corner, a Prayer Closet or a Home Altar go there frequently to ground yourself in your faith
- 2. Be in the habit of constantly praying to God throughout the day no matter what you're doing or where you're at He's present and listening
- 3. Start a habit of reading a Bible chapter a day
- 4. G.O.O.T.H .- Get out of the house
- 5. Turn off the news
- 6. Set your electronics down and fast from them for a few hours at a time
- 7. Play some holy music
- 8. Call or visit a friend who could use your encouragement, and that will encourage you
- 9. Start a journal and take notes about your life experiences Then get up and get going again
- 10. Set some attainable goals

You may start one of these, and then fall out of the habit. Restart it again. Our entire life is made up of standing up and falling down, standing up and falling down.

It's kind of like learning how to ride a bicycle. We could go and then fall over, go and fall over again, repeatedly. Eventually we learn.

Eventually we learn the secret of contentment that Saint Paul is talking about.

Training ourselves to stay closer to Him daily, we realize we are comfortable in His care.

What Does Fall Mean at Our Saviour?

Well it means a lot is going to change soon and the building will be very busy on any given day!

Green Bay Trinity Lutheran School classes began on August 25. Our Saviour Preschool 3K and 4K classes started on August 31/September 1. On any given weekday/school day that you come to OSLC, please watch for kids and extra cars. Have you noticed the fence in the green space? That is our new preschool play area! Please also note that you may see a line of cars in the parking lot from 7:30–8am and from 2:30–3:30pm for student drop off and pick up. It is requested that you avoid these times for SCRIP and other business that can be arranged at a different time.

Pastor Dave will lead a **new member class** on Wednesdays during September (1, 8, 15, 22 and 29). All members are welcome for a 'refresher' and non-members are welcome to learn about Christianity and Our Saviour before deciding if they want to join our family community.

Confirmation classes start September 8. If your 7th grader is not registered, contact the church office to get signed up. Classes meet Wednesdays with some Youth Night fun mixed in approximately every other week.

Sunday School classes will start with a rally during church on September 12. Children will sit with their parents in church, be dismissed to class and return to the Sanctuary before the end of worship. Online registration is now open or pick up a paper registration from Donna Biebel.

Fish fries return on the 2nd Friday of each month beginning September 10. You are welcome to **join the team** to help on one or more Friday nights (or Thursday prep). **Youth** are needed to bus tables and serve beverages; tips received will be earned for youth accounts to pay for NYG trips and more. Youth is the term at Our Saviour for those in grades 5–12. All are welcome to attend Youth Nights, beginning September 12, 2021 from 6–7:30pm. Check the online calendar for the Wednesday dates of all youth nights which will continue until February 23.

Parents and asked to sign up to provide a simple meal (sloppy joes, hot dogs, potato bar, etc.) for Youth Nights. Select one of the eight available and contact the office to reserve a night that works best for you.

NYG Youth include those entering 8th grade thru 12th grade this year. We have approximately 30 youth registered to attend and still have room for you to join us in Houston next year – July 9-12, 2022 – plus additional dates for the trip to and from Houston.

We have several way for you to raise funds for your youth account:

Lambeau Field – Youth aged 14 and older can work at a concession booth for any Packer games. Parents and other relatives for friends that work with OSLC can raise funds for their favorite youth. Minimum pay per event is \$85 with a possible bonus at the end of the season.

SCRIP – Purchase gift cards and earn a percentage from each store – Festival Foods, Shell gas, WalMart, Target, Kwik Trip and so many more. Contact the church office for details. One half of the profit earned from your card purchase can be deposited into your youth account.

Fall Flower Sale – This is a new fundraiser this year since the Spring Flower Sale went so well! All orders and payments must be received in the church office by Friday, September 10. Online orders can be placed at oslc-gb.org. A paper order form for youth can be picked up from the church office. A QR code is available at the Welcome Center. Youth can earn a portion of sales made at the Welcome Center when they schedule to take orders on Sundays (only September 5 still available).
